



Teaching Methodology:

Warm Up: (5 min)

- Welcome students in the class with a bright smile.
- Greet them with "Assalaam-o-Alaikum" and encourage them to reply with "Wa Alaikum Assalaam".
- Ask students to sit with discipline.
- show some picture cards of singular and plural to the students to give them the idea about singular and plural.
- Tell them that one is singular and more than one is plural.
- Now make two columns on board.
- Name the one as 'singular' and the second as 'plural'.
- Ask students at random to select any picture card and paste it in its relevant column.
- Encourage them to participate in the activity.

- Tell students that today we are going to learn about 'singular and plural'.
- Explain them again that one refers to singular, while more than one refers to plural.
- For example:



- Encourage students to share few more examples of singular and plural.
- Now tell them the rule that we add '6' to most nouns to make them plural. On the other hand, we add 'es' to the nouns ending with 's', 'x', 'ch' and 'o' to make them plural.
- Ask students to open textbook page 23.
- Read aloud the statement (iv).
- Read the examples and encourage the students to solve the exercise by their own.
- Help them if needed.
- Praise them for their correct answers.

Conclusion: (2 min)

Conclude the lesson by explaining them the concept again.

Revision: (5 min)


