

- Encourage them to participate in discussion.


Discussion: (25 min)

- Now ask students to write some words on sticky notes with the diphthongs written on board.
- Ask them to come one by one and place the word on board in the relevant column.



- After this activity, read the statement
 B① (ii) from textbook page 20 and tell them that a paragraph is made up of meaningful sentences. We also use transitional devices for a sequence.
- Read aloud the paragraph and let the students focus on transitional devices. Ask them to underline them.
- Help students to identify transitional devices.
- Tell them about the topic sentence of a paragraph. A topic sentence tells us about the main idea of the paragraph in the very first sentence/paragraph of a text.
- Encourage them for their active participation in these words: "You all have done a brilliant job", "Keep it up".

Conclusion: (3 min)

• Conclude the lesson by explaining them the concept again.
