Book: Pre Primary

Lesson: Letter 'O'

Subject: English

Day: 01

Student Learning Outcomes

Students will be able to:

- recognize the letter "o" and pronounce its sound.
- learn simple vocabulary of the letter "o".

Teacher's Note

- **Topic key points/ Introduction:**
- The sound of letter o is /oh/oh/oh/
- **Letter Tracing:**
- Tracing with index and middle fingers.
- **Key Vocabulary:**
- ostrich, orange, octopus, ox

Materials

- orange
- flash cards or objects starting with letter 'o'
- Textbook
- flash cards or animals starting with letter 'o'

Activities

Brainstorming/Warm up:

- Show students ostrich and ask them "What is this?".
- Talk about it in detail.
- Stress upon the starting sound of ostrich.

Development:

Introduce the shape and sound of the letter 'o' through a three-stage lesson focusing on sound recognition.

Activity 1: Recognition/Introduction/Naming Period:

- Teacher will show the objects beginning with the phonic letter "o" using flash cards.
- Make them pronounce the letter sound.
- Show them the flash cards of orange.

/o/..o/...orange.

Say (say it three times)

This is a orange.

Tell the students that /o/..o/...orange.

- Read pg # 19 aloud with students and make them recognize the pictures.

Identification:

- Teacher will place the vocabulary basket in front of students with the objects associated with letter "o". She will show the object e.g by introducing the sound of /owl and she will ask "Show me where is a orange.



Activities

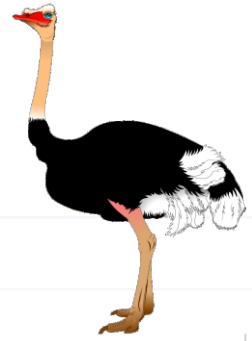
3rd stage (Confirmation):

She will show the object e.g. ostrich and ask “What is this?” (Response: /o/.../o/...ostrich). Later she will call the students one by one and ask them the same question related to other sound objects.

Use of 21st Century Skills with STEM Activities:



Tell the students that ostrich is the largest bird in the world.



Ask the students to look around and count the objects having the initial sound /o/.

Sum up:

Repeat the concept by displaying flash cards of letter 'o'.

Assessments

- The teacher will write different letters on the board and ask students to find out letter “o”.
- The teacher will show different objects to students and ask students do these all have the initial sound /o/?

Homework

Read letter “o” and its vocabulary from book.

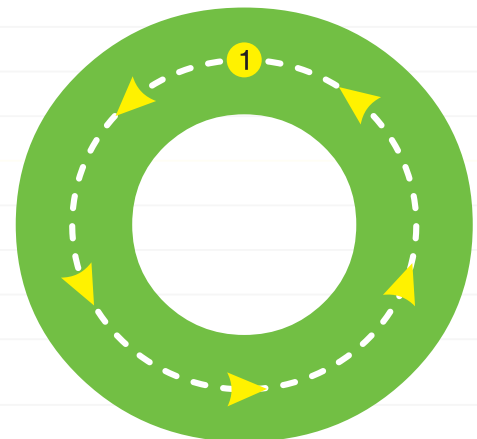
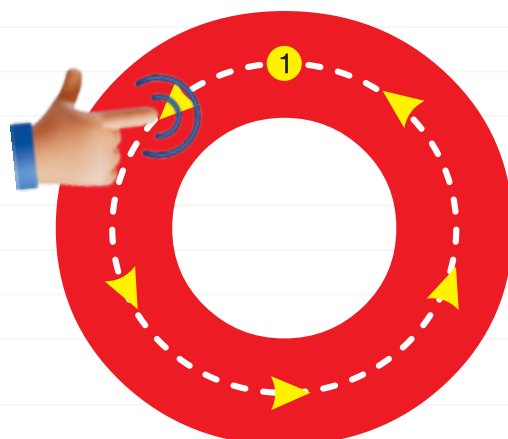
Brainstorming/Warm up:

Students will trace letter 'o' in air with two fingers and say its sound.

Assessments

Student will make letter 'o' in sand tray.

Homework

- Student will find at least two things at home that starts with letter 'o'.
- Trace the letter 'o' with fingers given on page # 19.

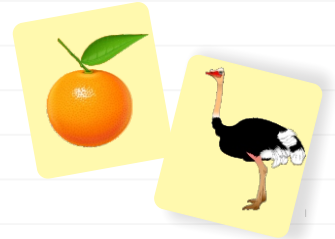

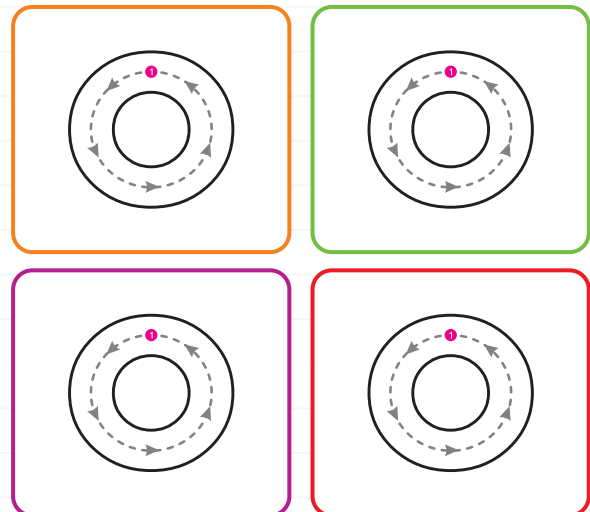
- Revise the sound and vocabulary of letter 'o' using the flash cards.

Day: 01

Student Learning Outcomes

Students will be able to:

- recognize the letter “p” and pronounce its sound.
- learn simple vocabulary of the letter “p”.

Teacher’s Note

- **Topic key points/ Introduction:**
- The sound of letter p is /ph/ph/ph/
- **Letter Tracing:**
- Tracing with index and middle fingers.
- **Key Vocabulary:**
- pear, panda, parrot, pumpkin

Materials

- panda
- flash cards or objects starting with letter ‘p’
- Textbook
- flash cards or animals starting with letter ‘p’

Activities

Brainstorming/Warm up:

- Show students panda and ask them "What is this?".
- Talk about it in detail.
- Stress upon the starting sound of panda.



Development:

Introduce the shape and sound of the letter 'p' through a three-stage lesson focusing on sound recognition.

Activity 1: Recognition/Introduction/Naming Period:

- Teacher will show the objects beginning with the phonic letter “p” using flash cards.
- Make them pronounce the letter sound.
- Show them the flash cards of panda.

/p../p/...panda.

Say (say it three times)

This is a panda.

Tell the students that /p../p/...panda.

- Read pg # 19 aloud with students and make them recognize the pictures.

Identification:

- Teacher will place the vocabulary basket in front of students with the objects associated with letter “p”. She will show the object e.g by introducing the sound of /panda and she will ask “Show me where is a penguin.”



Activities

3rd stage (Confirmation):

She will show the object e.g. pear and ask “What is this?” (Response: /p/.../p/...pear). Later she will call the students one by one and ask them the same question related to other sound objects.

Use of 21st Century Skills with STEM Activities:



Science

Tell the students that parrot is a beautiful bird.



Mathematics

Ask the students to look around and count the objects having the initial sound /p/.

Sum up:

Repeat the concept by displaying flash cards of letter 'p'.

Assessments

- The teacher will write different letters on the board and ask students to find out letter “p”.
- The teacher will show different objects to students and ask students do these all have the initial sound /p/?

Homework

Read letter “p” and its vocabulary from book.

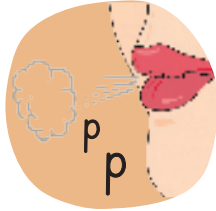
