## **Topic:**

Revision



#### **Learning outcomes:**

By the end of the lesson, students will:

- Recognize and recall all the letters of the alphabet.
- · Identify vowels and consonants.
- · Read and write CVC words.
- · Recognize and use sight words.

## WALT(We Are Learning To):

 Revise the alphabet, vowels, consonants, CVC words, and sight words.

## WLIF(What I'm Looking For):

 Students can identify letters, vowels, consonants, read CVC words, and use sight words correctly.

## **Leaning Materials:**

- Flashcards (alphabet, vowels, consonants, CVC words, sight words)
- · Whiteboard and markers
- Worksheets
- · Pencils, erasers



# Brainstorming (5 mintues):



- Write letters A to Z on the board and have students say each letter aloud.
- . Ask
- "Can you think of words that start with these letters?"
- "Which letters are vowels and which are consonants?"

# Introduction(10 mintues):



Greet students and explain that today's lesson will be a fun revision of all the things we've learned so far:

- · The alphabet.
- · Vowels and consonants.
- . CVC words.
- · Sight words.



# Main Activities (15 mintues):

#### **Activity 1:Alphabet Flashcards**

- Show flashcards of the alphabet (A-Z).
- · Ask students to name the letter and think of a word that begins with that letter.
- Use a fun song or chant to make it engaging.

#### **Activity 2:Vowels and Consonants**

- Write the vowels (a,e,i,o,u) and consonants on the board.
- Ask students to circle the vowels and underline the consonants.
- Provide a few examples of words for students to identify vowels and consonants (e.g., cat, bed, fox).



- · Write a few simple CVC words on the board: cat, hat, dog, bug, pen.
- · Ask students to read the words aloud.
- Have students form their own CVC words using letter cards or a whiteboard.
- Let students create sentences with CVC words (e.g., The cat sat on the mat).

#### **Activity 4:Sight Words**

- Show sight words flashcards like the, and, for, are, but, can, you, all.
- Ask students to repeat the words aloud and use them in simple sentences.
- Have students write a sentence using one or two of the sight words.



# Group Activities (20 minutes):

- · Divide students into small groups.
- Each group will receive a set of flashcards: alphabet letters, vowels, consonants, CVC words, and sight words.
- Students will take turns identifying and sorting the cards into the correct categories:
- Alphabet
- Vowels and Consonants
- · CVC Words
- · Sight Words

# Formative Assessment( 5 minutes):



- Observe students during group activities to assess their ability to sort and identify letters, vowels, consonants, and sight words.
- Check student worksheets for accuracy in identifying and writing words.
- Listen for correct usage of CVC words and sight words during sentence building.

# Wrap Up( 5 minutes):

Recap the lesson by asking:

- "Can anyone say the alphabet from A to Z?"
- "What are the vowels and consonants?"
- · "Who can read a CVC word?"
- · "What sight words did we learn today?"
- · Praise students for their effort and participation.

## Home Work:



- Complete a worksheet with a mix of alphabet letters, vowels and consonants, CVC words, and sight words.
- Write 3 sentences using sight words.
