Topic:

Vowels and Consonants

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Learning outcomes:

By the end of the lesson, students will:

- Identify vowels and consonants in the English alphabet.
- Differentiate between vowels and consonants in simple words.

WALT(We Are Learning To):

 Recognize vowels and consonants in the alphabet.

WLIF(What I'm Looking For):

Correctly identify vowels and consonants in words.

Leaning Materials:

- Flashcards (A-Z letters).
- Chart with vowels highlighted (a,e,lo,u,).
- Worksheets with words to underline vowels.
- Whiteboard and markers.

Brainstorming (5 mintues):



- Ask students to name letters randomly.
- · Highlight each letter they name as either a vowel or consonant.
- Encourage students to share examples of words starting with vowels and consonants (e.g., apple, ball).

Introduction(10 mintues):



- Start by singing the alphabet song to engage students.
- Write "A-Z" on the whiteboard and ask:
 - "Do you know how many letters are in the alphabet?"
 - "What are vowels?"
- Explain that vowels are special letters (a,e,i,o,u,) and all other letters are consonants.



Main Activities (15 mintues):



Activity 1:Vowel Chart

- Show a chart with vowels highlighted.
- Students take turns pointing to vowels and saying them aloud.

Activity 2:Letter Sorting

- Provide flashcards of letters.
- Students sort them into two groups: vowels and consonants.



Activity 3: Underline Vowels in Words

- · Hand out worksheets with simple words (e.g., cat, dog, sun).
- Students underline vowels in each word.





Group Activities (20 minutes)



Vowel Hunt

- · Divide students into small groups.
- · Give a short list of words and ask students to find and circle the vowels in each word.

Formative Assessment(5 minutes):



- · Check if students can correctly identify vowels and consonants during sorting activities.
- · Observe their ability to underline vowels in words.
- Monitor participation in the group activity.

Wrap Up(5 minutes):

- · Ask questions:
- · "What are the vowels?"
- "Which vowel is in the word 'cat'?"
- · Sing a short vowel song to reinforce learning.

Write 5 words and underline the vowels in each.
