Topic:

- Vowels and Consonants+ worksheet



Learning outcomes:

- By the end of the lesson, students will:
- Identify vowels and consonants in the English alphabet.
 - Recognize vowels in simple words.
 - Differentiate between vowels and consonants.

WALT(We Are Learning To):

- Identify vowels and consonants in the alphabet.

WLIF(What I'm Looking For):

- Students can differentiate between vowels and consonants.

Leaning Materials:

- Flashcards (A-Z letters).
- Vowel-consonant chart.
- Worksheet (Vowel and Consonant Identification).
- Whiteboard and markers.



Brainstorming (5 minutes):



- Ask students to randomly name letters.
- Highlight which letters are vowels and which are consonants on the board.
- Share examples of words starting with vowels and consonants (e.g., apple, dog).



Introduction(10 minutes):



- Begin with the alphabet song to grab students' attention.
- Write "A-Z" on the whiteboard and ask:
 - "Can you name the vowels?"
- Explain that vowels are a,e,i,o,u, and that all other letters are consonants.



Main Activities(15 minutes):



Activity 1:Vowel and Consonant Chart

- Use a colorful chart showing vowels and consonants.
- Students repeat after the teacher while pointing to each vowel and consonant.

Activity 2:Sorting Flashcards

- Provide flashcards of letters.
- Students sort them into "vowel" and "consonant" piles.

Activity 3: Worksheet Completion

Distribute worksheets where students:

- Circle vowels in words (e.g., cat, dog, egg).
- Write "V" for vowels and "C" for consonants beside letters.

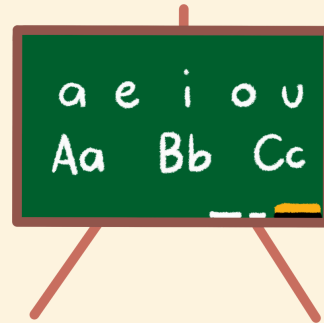


Group Activities(20 minutes)



Vowel Hunt

- Divide students into small groups.
- Provide a list of words and ask them to find and circle the vowels in each word.



Formative Assessment(5 minutes):



- Observe participation in sorting and group activities.
- Check worksheets for accuracy.

Wrap Up(5 minutes):



- Ask questions like:
 - "What are the vowels?"
 - "Which vowel is in the word 'bat'?"
- Recap by singing a short vowel song.

Write 5 words and underline the vowels in each.
